Scholarships part of plan to bump enrollment

As part of an effort to increase enrollment for its second year, Christian Education Leadership Academy in Pewaukee will offer \$3,000 scholarships to new

students.

CELA co-founders Brian and Nancy Nahey will provide a \$3,000 Expansion Student Scholarship for each student

newly enrolled in grades 5K through eight for the 2016-17 school year.

The scholarship is in addition to the \$5,000 ongoing Founder's Credit from the Nahey Charitable Foundation. Each new student will continue to receive the yearly scholarship, which will be reduced by \$400 per year for as long as the student attends CELA.

The scholarship and credit means tuition for a new CELA student in grades 5K through eight will be \$6,750 in 2016-17 and \$7,150 for 2017-18.

Tuition for 4K will be \$4,000 per student.

CELA, which is nearing the end of its inaugural year, recently announced plans to boost enrollment for the 2016-17 school year, filling a third section of classes to increase enrollment from 250 to 400 students and establishing a waiting list to handle future enrollments.

also has announced dates for open houses where community members can take a tour of the school, on Ryan Street just north of Highway 16.

The first one was Wednesday, May 25. A second is planned for Tuesday, June 7.

Tours will be offered at 6, 6:20, 6:40 and 7 p.m. The tours will highlight the school's "pod" classroom design and demonstrate high-end technology used

by students, such as ActiView 324, ClassFlow and Lecture Capture.
