## Logic and Reasoning Elective Class

This past Friday, was the last class of the Logic and Reasoning Elective. Students worked in groups to create towers out of toothpicks and marshmallows. Students had to think and act quickly, delegate tasks across the group, and use critical thinking skills to formulate and execute a plan for creating the tallest tower in the class. Each group came up with unique ideas, including one group creating an assembly line creating cubes. Then another group adding multiple pyramids together. The pyramid group ended up with the winning tower of 18 inches! It
was fun to see how the students collaborated with one another to get the job done!

## Sixth Grade Math Class Plays Game

The sixth grade math class is reinforcing and practicing what they learned about finding surface area and volume by playing Connect 4 against each other. Students find the volume and surface area of shapes as they try to become the first player to connect four consecutive spaces on their game board. It includes rectangular prisms, triangular prisms, cylinders, cones, and pyramids. Students enjoyed playing the game.

## Students Play Volley balloon in PE Class

Younger students practiced volleyball skills with balloons this week. Students learned how to keep up the balloon without touching the ground, how to strike or spike the balloon, and even learned how to set the balloon. This activity develops hand-eye coordination, gross and fine motor control, and the ability to track the balloon. As students become familiar and comfortable with these skills, volleyballs will later be introduced.


## Fifth Graders Make Oobleck

Fifth graders celebrated Dr. Seuss's birthday by reading Bartholomew and the Oobleck and then made oobleck in Science class. They followed the steps of the scientific method to answer the question, "What state of matter is oobleck?" First, they formulated a hypothesis. Then, they tested it by making oobleck. Next, they recorded their observations and data. Finally, they formed a conclusion. The fifth graders concluded that oobleck can be a solid or liquid depending on how much pressure is applied to it. They learned that since it does not have a constant viscosity, it is classified as a non-Newtonian liquid. What a fun way to learn!

## CVLD Class Update

The second week of LOVE focused on John 3:16 and 1 Corinthians 13:4-7. Chapel families made more birthday cards for A Soldier's Child Foundation. They began their study of FRIENDSHIP this week with discussions on Jesus being our ultimate friend. Students also learned about keeping good company because those that we spend time with will influence us.
