
Have a wonderful summer! We can't wait to see you all again in July and again in August for our Back to School Open House and Picnic and hopefully throughout the summer!

Presentation Day

It was a busy Friday afternoon full of presentations. The eighth graders presented their Washington DC Trip Project to the school. Each student worked on a project about one memorial/monument they visited.

The seventh graders completed their Lost in Space Project, also known as the crosscurricular project. Students completed a project as a way of demonstrating mastery of 7th grade material from across their core classes. The idea for the project is that in the future, the earth has been tarnished beyond repair, meaning that humans have to create a new colony in space. Students selected a biome from the earth and a country on the earth that includes that biome to use as their basis for research.

The 3rd graders presented their state power point slide show to the 8th grade class. They researched a state and created a slideshow using Power Point. What a great afternoon of learning!
